How can Parents Help?

• One of the most important things you can do over the summer to prepare your five-year-old for kindergarten is to help your child to become more independent.









Set a Consistent Routine



- 1. set a bedtime
- 2. get up early and go through the morning preparations getting dressed, eating breakfast, packing a backpack and any other morning rituals.
- 3. Together create a special good-bye (high five, hugs, special handshake, etc)









Foster Independence

- Your kindergartner should be able, without assistance, to take care of their personal needs such as:
 - Care for their toilet needs and remember to wash their hands.
 - Use tissue to blow their nose.
 - Zip and button pants and jacket independently.
 - Tie shoelaces.
 - Pack/unpack a backpack
 - Open their snack











Independence and Responsibility

• Your 5-year-old will gain a sense of independence and responsibility if you teach and expect your child to:

- Put their own clothes away.
- Help set the table.
- Help with laundry and shopping.
- Help care for pets.
- Clean up after themselves, putting toys away.
- Listen when others are speaking to them.
- Follow simple directions.












Sit Quietly for 15 Minutes
















Follow 3 Directions

Social Skills

- Give your children opportunities to interact with other children in preschool, church or social groups or play dates.
- Teach your child how to express her feelings if she doesn't like something.
- Role-play different situations she might experience on the playground or at school. Help her find solutions for typical problems she might encounter.











Write & Recognize First Name





It is very important for children to learn early on to write a capital letter for only the first letter of their name.

Letters should be written top to bottom, left to right.

Students should be able to recognize their name.



























Hold Scissors Correctly

Thumb on top















Cut on Lines

















Ideas for Cutting Practice

- Purchase a good pair of child-safe scissors and let your child practice.
- Give her old magazines or newspapers to cut up, or allow her to make a collage of the things she likes by cutting them from magazines and gluing them to a piece of paper.
- Cutting play dough is also fun for children.
- Cut up paper in strips to make "spaghetti."










Color Within the Lines












Read! Read! Read!

- Run your finger under the words as you read to your child to help her learn that words go from left to right and top to bottom.
- Look and discuss the illustrations
- Ask thought provoking questions as you read
- Read daily with your child











WHY READ 20 MINUTES AT HOME?

Student A Reads	Student B Reads	Student C Reads

If they start reading for 20 minutes per night in Kindergarten, by the end of 6th grade, Student A will have read for the equivalent of 60 school days, Student B will have read for 12 school days, and Student C will have read for 3.
