

2019-20 Highlights

- Claimed three conference championships: men's soccer, volleyball, and men's basketball.
- Azusa Pacific men's soccer became the first PacWest team in conference history to finish the regular season undefeated, as the Cougars went 18-0.
- Azusa Pacific volleyball won its second consecutive PacWest title and made its third straight trip to the NCAA West Regionals, where the Cougars advanced all the way to the Regional Championship.
- In his first year as the head coach of APU's men's basketball, Peter Bond led the Cougars to a 25-4 record. They finished the season ranked sixth in the nation.
- Azusa Pacific tennis swept the Fall ITA regional titles, claiming the women's singles, women's doubles, men's singles, and men's doubles crowns.
- Produced 21 All-Americans, 4 Academic All-Americans, and 3 PacWest Scholar-Athletes of the Year.

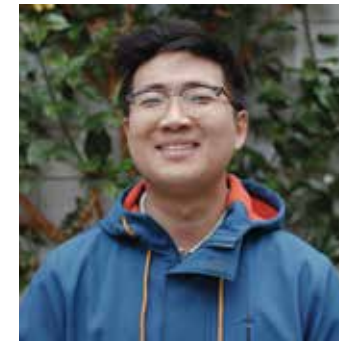



1. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, better known as the FAFSA, as soon as possible after October 1. It’s the first and most important step in determining what financial aid you qualify for. **APU’s FAFSA Code: 001117.**
2. Learn more about the many types of aid available and what they mean for you, including scholarships, grants, and loans.
3. Once you’re accepted to colleges, you’ll receive financial aid offers. Review and compare these offers carefully, and don’t hesitate to call us if you have any questions.
