## 2021-22 Supplemental Factors

- Each CSU campuses will determine the supplemental factors used
- Impacted campuses and programs may also use supplemental factors
- Supplemental factors could include:
  - Courses exceeding minimum “a-g” courses
  - Household income
  - Extracurricular involvement
  - Work experience
  - Math/QR GPA
  - Educational program participation
  - Others

- ALL students are strongly encouraged to enroll in a yearlong senior-year English course and a mathematics/quantitative reasoning course
- Student-specific Early Assessment Program (EAP) guidance will largely not be available at the time of senior year course registration
- These courses could include:
  - Expository Reading and Writing (ERWC)
  - Math Reasoning with Connections (MRWC)



# Fall 2021 First-Year Students

- Unofficial transcripts** You'll be asked to enter all the courses you've completed on your CSU application; those that are currently in progress; and any you plan to take. Transcripts will be requested by campuses as needed.
- Test scores (SAT, ACT, AP or IB)** Report test results so far as well as any future test dates.
- Your Social Security number**, if you have one.
- Your citizenship status**
- A method of payment** You can pay the application fee by credit card.
- Your parent's citizenship status**
- Annual income** Your parents' if you are a dependent; your income if you are independent
- Your parent's employment background and two recommendations** Applies only if you're applying to EOP.
- California statewide student ID** Optional; every K-12 student in a California public school is assigned an ID number. The number should be printed on your transcript.





CSU Validation applies to: Math, Language Other than English (LOTE) and Chemistry

- Math – C or better in the second semester of Geometry will validate the first semester, C or better in the first semester of Algebra II validates both semesters of Algebra I, Statistics will validate Algebra I and Algebra II, but will not validate Geometry, Advanced math validates the entire sequence.
- LOTE - C or better in a semester of a higher-level course validates a lower-level course
- Chemistry - C or better in the second semester of Chemistry validates the first semester

## Standardized Tests (ACT, SAT, AP, IB)

- For Fall 2021 freshman admissions, standardized tests ***will not be used to determine admissions eligibility.***
- SAT/ACT scores will be used for placement in math and English courses by campuses
- You can enter your ACT, SAT, **AP, IB** tests that have been taken or planning on taking.
- If tests have not taken or are not scheduled to take any standardized tests you can opt out.

  - **First Generation:** neither of your parents graduated from college.
  - Meet the **EOP Family Income Criteria**
- The EOP application is built into the Cal State Apply application. Students can submit the Cal State Apply application without the EOP portion complete and come back to it.


