Integrated Math 2 Honors builds and strengthens student's conceptual knowledge of tools of geometry, introduction to proofs, properties of triangles, similarity and congruence, using congruence theorems, properties of polygons, circles, quadratic functions, polynomials and inverse functions. This course is has an accelerated pace and covers more topics than Math 2 CP.

The recommended prerequisites for this course are an A in both semesters of Math 1 as well as "Standard Exceeded" on the 8th grade CAASPP Test.

It is critical that each student is a self-directed learner; does all homework problems and reviews notes every night.

MATERIALS

1. Chromebook to bring every day.

HOMEWORK AND CLASSWORK

Homework will be assigned every class and is due at the beginning of the next class period. All homework will be kept in your notebook. Homework answers will be available online on Google Classroom for students to review and correct *before* coming to class. Homework will be submitted digitally through Google Classroom. See the homework requirements for more specific information. Students must show all work or justifications to receive credit. **NO WORK=NO CREDIT.** Students are also responsible for keeping all graded work in the event a score is inputted incorrectly. **Homework must be legible to receive credit.**

LATE WORK

Any assignment that is not correctly submitted by the due date/time is considered late. Late work may be turned in for half-credit. I do NOT accept Renaissance Reward Cards. Instead, each student will get FIVE assignments per semester they can submit for full credit (if the assignment is late or incomplete). See the homework requirements for more specific information.

NOTEBOOKS

Students will keep all homework, notes and classwork organized in a math specific notebook. Notebooks will be collected at the end of each unit and graded. See the Notebook requirements for more specific information.

ASSESSMENTS

There will be at least assessment for each unit that we cover. These are not only used to measure student learning, but also to help students develop strong study skills that will transfer to other classes as well as their post-secondary education. There will be a comprehensive final exam each semester which will be worth 200 points (2 test grades).

NO TEST CORRECTIONS OR RETAKES WILL BE ALLOWED

GRADE CHECKS

It is the student's responsibility to monitor their grades and bring any issues or discrepancies to my attention immediately so they can be corrected or resolved. Parents and students are strongly encouraged to check the **Aeries Parent Portal** on a weekly basis to view the most current grades for EVERY class and to have an updated e-mail address on file with the office.

IF YOU WERE ABSENT

- You will have up to as many days as you were absent to turn in missed assignments. (For instance, if you were absent on a Monday, you would have to turn in absent work no later than Wednesday)
 - **Absent work must be scanned and turned into the Google Form posted on the class Google Classroom**
- Tests and quizzes will need to be made up the day you return regardless of how many days you were absent.
 - There will be no postponement for students who are absent days prior to a test or quiz.
 - For extreme circumstances, I must be notified via email prior to the test.
- Students are responsible to copy notes from a classmate for the day(s) they are absent as well as checking my website for any handouts or videos that may have been posted.

- **All homework, worksheets and notes will be posted on Google Classroom daily.**

ACADEMIC HONESTY

Cheating of ANY kind will result in a score of ZERO on the homework assignment, test, or quiz.
