

- · Language Arts skills will be integrated into all subject areas.

MATH




The students will learn multiple strategies for addition and subtraction, including a process of adding and subtracting called Touch Point Math.

Math Fact Memorization will be a part of your child's math routine. Students will be expected to achieve **fluency** in addition and subtraction facts to 10 and have the ability to add and subtract within 20 by the end of the school year.

Students can access work, videos, and a digital toolbox through the Savvas Easybridge app on ClassLink.

POSITIVE REWARDS

- Wickman uses a positive behavior support known as Winner tickets. They are awarded to students for displaying positive behavior and for following the classroom and school rules. The school has prize drawings each month.
- Verbal praise and small incentives are also used when students are "caught being good".
- We will have a raffle in class each Friday and a student store each week.




ACCELERATED

*AR is a supplemental reading comprehension program. Students are required to take at least two AR tests per week. AR provides excellent reading comprehension practice and helps build vocabulary.

*AR tests can be taken M - F at school.

EPIC AND IXL

*Epic has digital books and educational videos. Students can listen and/or read books by interest or AR level. It is available M-F from 7:00 am to 3:00pm.

* IXL is an individualized computer program that your child uses to develop their math and reading skills.

IXL is an intuitive educational program that your child uses to develop their math and reading skills. For homework students will complete four individualized recommended skills in math and/or language arts. Students can access IXL on the Classlinks page.



Coding at Wickman Code Ninjas Instructors

- Coding has been called "the literacy of the 21st century". It is a key aspect of understanding our technologically advanced world.
- <u>Impact</u> (partnered with Microsoft MakeCode), a new education platform designed to teach coding and computer science skills, uses learning algorithms to assess each child's needs and create a unique learning path tailored to their interests.
- Students gain valuable skills beyond technology, such as confidence, logic, resourcefulness, and problem solving.
- · Students are able to work through projects and levels at their own pace.
- All Wickman students (K 6th grade) participate in coding classes every other week.
- Code Ninjas instructors push in to classrooms on Tuesdays & Wednesdays (2 instructors per class).
- Coding is COMPLETELY funded by parent donations. Thank you for your support!
