



*Sickness/Absences

If you know in advance that your child will be absent, please notify me when possible.

Board Policy requires a parent verification of each absence within 5 school days of the student's return to school.

Contacting the teacher is not the same as clearing the absence through the office.

*Independent Study

Absences lasting more than 5 days are eligible for Independent Study. While gone, your child will be required to complete the daily classwork they will miss. I will prepare the classwork along with directions, as long as I am given ample time to prepare (*2 week notice). All classwork will need to be completed and return the day your child comes back to school.

Please contact the office for a Independent Study contract. It will need to be filled out and signed before the first date of your child's independent study.









- Schedule medical and dental appointments after school

Kindergarten Arrival & Dismissal

<u>Kindergarten Bus Lane Pass</u>

Each family will receive a Kindergarten Bus Lane Pass. You will need it to enter the bus lane from San Antonio Ave for arrival/dismissal (Tuesdays only). Please make sure it is clearly displayed on the dashboard.

<u>Arrival</u> – All Kindergarten students can be dropped off from the bus lane off San Antonio Ave. Upon entering the lane, please pull your car all the way forward. **Do NOT park and get out**. The teacher on duty will help your child get out. They will then walk them over to the double gate (Kindergarten Entrance) where they will line up with their class. Please teach your child how to buckle/unbuckle their seatbelt. We will expect them to do this independently.

<u>Rainy Days-</u>Students will walk directly to classroom.

<u>Dismissal</u> – Enter the front of school from Schaefer. Follow the designated route and pull all the way forward. **Do not get out of your car**. I will walk the scholars through the main school entrance at dismissal time. <u>We will line up and your child will say "I see my person"</u>. I will dismiss your child to you or walk them over to the car and help them get in. Please do not call for your child to come without me hearing/seeing them. Scholar safety is my number one priority. If someone different will be picking up your child please let me know. I will ask for a picture ID.





Tuesdays and School Wide Minimum Days

Dismissal on Tuesdays and all other school wide designated minimum days, will be done from the **San Antonio Bus Lane.**

**NOTE: Older Siblings may pick up your child and walk them to the front of the school to be picked up.

Language Arts Math

These comprehensive programs include many different lessons and activities that will provide each child the opportunity to expand their knowledge in the areas of Math, Reading, Phonemic Awareness, and Writing. I will also provide supplemental instruction and curriculum in all academic areas. I do realize that not all children learn in the same ways, or at the same pace. I will try my best to provide any/all necessary challenge/remedial work that each individual child may need.





- When reading with a beginning reader, ask your child to look at the pictures first. Help them make predictions. Ask them what they think the story will be about. Talk about the story after. Was your child's prediction about what the story might be about, correct?
- Model finger-point reading or tracking. That means to follow the words with your finger from left to right as you read them.
- Encourage your child to name letters and the sounds they make and then "squeeze" (blend) those sounds together to say the word. Practice this a few times and encourage your child to blend the sounds together faster each time.
- **Practice sight words daily**. Sight words are words that are commonly read, spoken, and used in speaking, reading, and writing. Memorization of these sight words allows the student to read them very quickly when seen in print. This helps build reading fluency. I will provide flashcards that your child will use to practice. I will also test your child when they have memorized the list.



Be patient! Beginning readers may read slowly.





How do Kindergarteners become confident writers?

 They start by drawing pictures. Give your child a blank notebook and have them draw. Encourage them to describe what they have drawn using complete sentences.
 "Kid Spelling" or Phonetic writing comes next.

The "Kid Spelling"/Phonetic writing process involves using the following strategies:

- 1. Say the word that they want to write.
- 2. Stretch out the word slowly (imagine stretching a piece of bubble gum). Example /b/-/a/-/t/
- By stretching the word out and saying it slowly, they are able to hear more sounds in the word.
- 3. Write the letters that represent the sounds that THEY hear in the word.

This type of spelling is often incorrect, but as your child is exposed to more phonetic rules they will begin to apply those rules when spelling words.



Children need social-emotional skills to thrive in the classroom and in life. Social-emotional learning (SEL) curricula teaches children techniques to:

- Gain confidence
- Set goals
- Make better decisions
- Collaborate with others in work and play
- Navigate the world more effectively

It is important to constantly assess the state of your child's social-emotional health as well as their physical well-being.

Social Emotional Learning

Invite your child to talk about their feelings and fears. Some children may have difficulty expressing how they are feeling, with words. Use a "Feelings Chart" to help your child find the right words to identify how they are feeling. Help your child to understand that their feelings are valid.

Do daily "Social-Emotional" check ins with your child.




Kindergarten homework will be a packet of activity pages and a nightly reading log that are designed for daily reinforcement of the skills your child learned that day in class. The homework packet will come home on Monday in your child's homework folder. The folder and homework packet will be returned on FRIDAYS.

Homework Routines

- Have your child complete only one page per day. This will help establish a daily homework routine.
- Have your scholar write their name at the top of their paper first.
- Follow all directions.
- Use a pencil for all writing and crayons ONLY for all coloring.
- Make sure homework is done in a "quiet area" at the same time each day.
- Make sure your child has all of the "tools" they need before they start homework.

Tools include: a sharpened pencil, scissors, crayons, a glue stick, items for counting (beans, counters, anything small)



Positive Affirmations

- Students are rewarded for good behavior with:
 - positive reinforcement
 - personal notes/messages home
 - verbal praise
 - High Fives
 - Class Cheers
 - Marbles
 - Whole class behavior rewards
 - "Shiners"
 - Scholarships

Behavior Expectations Consequences

- Positive Encouragement
 - Verbal Warnings / Counsel
- Missing "Shiner"/ turning of # card
 - . Communication to Parent
- 5. Referral to principal
 - *Note: Message to Parent depends on severity of situation as well/how often reminders occurred.
 - *Note: Serious Behaviors will be directly reported to administration
 - Repeated offenses will be logged (4xs) will be reported to administration



"Shiners"/Behavior Management

1st infraction: verbal warning. Still receives a "shiner"

2nd infraction: student loses their "shiner" for the day

3rd infraction: Will not receive a star



4th infraction: Thinking table (no star and Message to Parent).

***5th infraction: Office Referral (Note: this is logged several times prior to the referral being sent up)

If needed I will send a Parentsquare message to you during/after class if necessary. Only you the parent will see the messages that are sent to you. The above system is NOT linear. Students can earn stars or shiners back, depending on behavior, attitude, and willingness to try.

Academic Expectations

Positive Affirmations

- Students are rewarded for good behavior with:
 - verbal praise
 - Scholarships
 - Marbles



Consequences

- Incomplete Classwork: due to off task behavior (Finish work with teacher or ask to complete and return back)
- Academics goes with the Shiner passport system as well





- Students will be assessed throughout the school year based on various subject criteria and the Essential Standards
 - Essential Standards: Emphasis will be placed on key standards
- * District Assessments, including the Essential Standards Assessment and Fastbridge, will be administered each trimester.
- * Math tests will be given at the end of each chapter or topic as well as through ESGI (online testing platform).
- Language arts assessments will be administered through ESGI (online testing platform) to assess students on ELA curriculum such as letters, sounds, and story retelling.







In Kindergarten, your child will be assessed purely on their ability to master kinder standards throughout the year. Instead of traditional grading such as an A, B, C, etc., your student will be given a grade using a number scale based on 1-4.

The scale is as follows: 4- Excelling in the standard 3-Meeting the Standard 2- Progressing toward the standard 1- Not meeting the standard



COUSD Grading Descriptors

4 - **Excelling**: Students at the Excelling level of performance are consistently performing at grade level, can demonstrate independence, and can extend the grade level standards, when applicable, expected a this point of the school year.


3 - Achieving: Students at the Achieving level of performance demonstrate an adequate understanding of and ability to apply skills needed to meet grade level standards at this point of the school year.

2 - Progressing: Students at the Progressing level of performance are partially meeting the grade level standards expected at this point of the school year.

1 - Beginning/Standard Not Met: Students at the Beginning/Standard Not Met level are not yet meeting grade level standards expected a this point of the school year.
