Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals - Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP)

All students are provided a high-quality teaching and learning environment.

Staff, parents, families, and students are connected and engaged at their school to ensure student success.

All students are prepared for college and career beyond graduation.

School Goals

Goal 1: 100% of grade level teams will respond with intervention and extension for at least 3 CFAs with Tier 1 and Tier 2 instruction, as measured by artifacts showing intervention & extension plans by the end of the 2022-2023 school year.

Goal 2: By 5/1/2023, we will score a 2 out of 2 on Tier 1 TFI point 1.7 dealing with PBIS Professional Development. By 5/1/2023, we will score a 2 out of 2 on Tier 2 TFI point 2.4 dealing with Request for Assistance.

Goal 3: On the 2023 CAASPP, the percent of student scoring "Standards Met" and "Standards Exceeded" (combined) in ELA and in Math will increase by 5% overall.

In the Classroom

As a first-grade teacher, I will engage all students with a vibrant learning climate and high-quality instruction. Listed below are some of the student learning strategies your child will use this year.

GOAL 1: Using Step Up to Writing, Thinking Maps, and other instructional strategies, students will learn narrative, informational, and opinion writing.

GOAL 2: Students will engage in math instruction by use of manipulatives and other learning styles to understand addition, subtraction, measurement, time, and other math topics.

GOAL 3: Students will develop a love of reading by being exposed to rich texts, exciting books, and the opportunity to take AR tests to earn points towards medals.

At Home

Here are some ideas of how families can support students' success.

I will provide these activities and/or supports at home to support my child's learning this year.

- Look through their Rustler folder every Monday.
- Stay involved in the parent-child activities at home.
- Read 20 minutes a day with your child and discuss what was read:
 - informational text questions: main idea and key details
 - literary text questions: characters, setting, and retelling events
- Help your child memorize addition and subtraction facts to 20.
- Find fun ways for your child to write and practice penmanship.
- Encourage your child to utilize math practice on Dreambox and reading practice on Lexia.
