Partnership Opportunities

- Support Services Staff typically assist students with non-academic needs, including food insecurity, housing instability, transportation, or other needs. These staff can be a valuable connection point for reaching families for special events, recreational programming, or broader community outreach.
- McKinney-Vento Liaisons at each LEA
 address the needs of students experiencing
 homelessness or housing instability. Sharing
 information about rent or utility assistance
 programs, food pantries, and other social
 services can be valuable resources for them
 in meeting student needs. Often they can
 become valuable referral sources for your
 programs.
- Afterschool Programs are another way to collaborate with local schools. Partners who can provide quality afterschool programming on-site, or with transportation provided, ensures convenient access to enriching activities and academic support for students.

The HOPE Partnership Focus on Youth Collaborative

Many HOPE partnerships have arisen out of the Focus on Youth Collaborative. The Focus on Youth (FOY) Collaborative meets monthly and is committed to 1) annually assess community needs and 2) seek out funding to implement, sustain and/or scale youth services. Since its inception in 2000, FOY has generated more than 25 million in grant funding to serve youth.

FOY provides an umbrella of accountability for HOPE, McKinney-Vento CARE and other youth programs. Committee members represent various agencies including CVUSD, YMCA, prison facilities, police departments, community and faith-based organizations, service clubs, neighboring counties and LEAs, and the cities of Chino, Chino Hills, and Ontario.

HOPE In Action

Outreach & Special Events

The HOPE team hosts tables at citywide special events and festivals. This city outreach helps ensure residents know what services and programs are available through the schools and allows the community to donate items to support the program.

Donation & Collection Drives

Many community organizations partner with HOPE by sponsoring collection drives to support the community CARE closet that allows students to shop for clothing, receive toiletry and hygiene items, and school supplies at no cost. These resources would not be possible without ongoing community support and donations.
