Description of Course - AP Drawing is designed for students who are seriously interested in the practical experience of art. The instructional goals of the Studio Art AP course can be described as follows:

- Encourage creative as well as systematic investigation of formal and conceptual issues.
- Emphasize making art as an ongoing process that involves the student in informed and critical decision making.
- Develop technical skills and familiarize students with the functions of the visual elements.
- Encourage students to become independent thinkers who will contribute inventively and creatively to their culture through the making of art.

AP Drawing is not based on a written examination; instead, students submit portfolios to the College Board for evaluation at the end of the school year.

Rationale for Course - The AP program is a cooperative endeavor that helps high school students complete college-level courses and permits colleges to evaluate, acknowledge, and encourage that accomplishment through the granting of appropriate credit and placement.
