From Vision to Reality...


Since the inception of the HOPE Centers in 2014, a vision of former CVUSD Superintendent Wayne Joseph, the program has grown and developed to become an integral part of not only the school district, but the Chino Valley community.

Academic resources alone cannot compensate when children have unmet basic needs or when families are in crisis. In response, we have come together from different walks of life and backgrounds to form the ultimate community collaborative designed to seamlessly operate in support of some of our most vulnerable students and families. Case managers, parenting facilitators, social workers, mental health practitioners and support staff work together to identify and remove barriers that could keep children and youth from being successful in all areas of life.

In March 2020, the world as we knew it was turned upside down and the demand for resources was overwhelming. Many working families lost their jobs, fell behind with bills, feared eviction, struggled to place food on the table, and worried about their health. Students felt anxious about Distance Learning, struggled with technology, and worried about their families.

HOPE jumped into action. Case managers made home visits to drop off groceries and school lunches, assisted students and parents with technology concerns, connected individuals to local health clinics and COVID testing centers, provided gift cards, and coordinated curbside pick-up of emergency hygiene items and school supplies. As families faced the trauma of the pandemic on various levels, staff worked tirelessly to address needs at the individual and family level.

District Staff, City of Chino employees, community members, faith-based partners, caring individuals... all coming together for the purpose of **building the bridge** to assist our fellow human beings needing extra support, compassion and **HOPE!**
