

## FINDING HOPE IN A COVID YEAR

No one would have been able to imagine the challenges that students, families, and schools would face in navigating education, health, and safety during a pandemic. CVUSD students began the 2020 school year at home through Distance Learning. In March, 2021, Blended Learning allowed some students to return to school campuses. Technology questions, mental health concerns, communication between school and home...all relevant and pressing issues that affected many community families.

The HOPE Program, located at the Chino Valley Adult School, made certain there were no breaks or gaps in critical support resources and services for students and their families. In the 2020/21 school year, HOPE assisted over 3,700 individuals with Medi-Cal, Cal-Fresh, Cal-WORKs applications, mental health referrals, food resources, healthcare connections, tutoring supports, and rental/utility assistance. Additionally, the CARE Closet provided clothing, school supplies, and personal care items for over 1,200 individuals!

#### **COMMUNITY EFFORT = COMMUNITY IMPACT**

Utilizing the extensive network of relationships with collaborative partners within the Chino Valley, HOPE was able to connect students and families to boxed food and staple items, weekend meals, holiday sponsorships and donations, and critical funds for utility and rental assistance. Understanding that housing instability can weigh heavily on a student's ability to focus and learn, HOPE worked closely with local government and non-profit agencies. Families that had been negatively impacted by COVID-19 were connected to CDBG (Community Development Block Grant), the City of Chino's Rental Assistance Program, and other county programs for financial lifelines.

Partnerships have been central to the successful operation of the HOPE Program and the family resource centers. Case management has significantly impacted many struggling students and families. Utilizing available resources and support services, we can help address barriers to learning, assist with basic needs, and strengthen the whole family to achieve lasting personal and academic growth.


