## MCKINNEY-VENTO CARE PROGRAM

Students are considered homeless or in transition if they lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence under the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act reauthorized by Title IX, Part A of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA).

**IF YOU ARE** sharing housing due to economic hardship, the loss of your own housing, or a similar reason;

**OR** Living in a motel, hotel, trailer park, emergency or transitional shelter, park, campground, or vehicle;

**OR** are an unaccompanied youth;

OR have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human begins;
THEN you may be eligible to certain educational rights and services under the McKinney-Vento Act.

## YOUR CHILD'S RIGHT INCLUDE:

- Immediate school enrollment, even if lacking paperwork normally required.
- Continued attendance in the school of origin or the school of attendance area where you are presently living.
- Services available to other students, e.g., school meals, afterschool programs.
- Transportation to and from school of origin, upon parent or liaison request.
- The right to initiate the dispute process if you disagree with an enrollment decision.

Unaccompanied youth (youth not in the physical custody of a parent or guardian) must enrolled in school immediately, even if they do not have a parent or guardian present.
