Required Materials

Students must come to class everyday with the following items:

1. Access to Google classroom and the internet. All assignments will be turned in via google classroom unless otherwise directed.

2. Daily Planner, Calendar (whether it is digital or paper)

Between our busy schedule and your additional responsibilities for your academics, athletics, other clubs, work, and family responsibilities, it is impossible to remember everything. With a daily planner or calendar, you can never say, "But, Mrs. Rigo-Witt, I forgot!"

Grades & Evaluation

This includes but is not limited to virtual and in person school activities & assignments such as:

- Leadership assignments reflecting on personal skills, beliefs and group projects
- Assemblies/Rallies
- Game participation
- Sales: Student store, Juice It Up and spirit wear at games
- Lunchtime Activities
- Team/Individual Performance
- Performance as an Officer/ASB or Senate Member
- Integrity

Throughout the semester, we will have lessons and assignments dealing with different Leadership, or school-related topics. Some of these will be completed in class, others will be homework. It will be your responsibility to turn them in on time using Google Classroom. We will be using google and office 365 apps to complete some assignments.

The Freshmen Leadership class overall grade will be weighted. 50%-attendance and participation. 50%-assignments.

Please do not assume that you will earn an easy "A" in this class. You will have to earn it by showing that you are committed to making a difference on a daily basis.

Spirit days are a part of your grade! As a member of this class, you are expected to dress-up for ALL spirit days. On Fridays, you are expected to wear DLHS spirit wear and school spirit or college gear on Mondays. Spirit wear for cheer, football, basketball, AVID, band, etc is acceptable.

As a member of the class, you will be given a leadership shirt free of charge sometime 1st semester. If you lose or damage the shirt it will be your responsibility to get a replacement. If you drop the class or asked to leave, the shirt should be returned.

Time

In the virtual world, it will be expected that leaders interact on different digital platforms. This may be Instagram, twitter, etc. When appropriate, students will be asked to participate in work days and events in the future. When in a traditional classroom setting, hours can be earned by working on activities/tasks at lunch, or before/after school hours. Specific activities/tasks that qualify for hours include working shifts at the Student Store, working the sound system and participation at sporting events, attending club meetings at lunch or after school, hanging posters/fliers around campus, working on ASB activities/events during non-school hours. Hours must be completed in detail. Writing "Poster painting" or "Committees" doesn't tell me what you were actually working on. Begin your description with a verb (i.e. "Created judging sheets for Car Show" or "Made Car Show flier"). If you are creating signs, don't write "Signs" or "posters". You need to specifically say "Made two signs for volleyball game on Thursday and hung up in the ASB quad."

DON LUGO HIGH ASB LEADERSHIP CLASS CODE OF CONDUCT AND EXPECTATIONS

As a DLHS student leader, I understand that I am held to a higher standard of behavior than my peers. I understand that I am viewed as a role model to my peers. I understand that I represent the ideals and values of the leadership organization and DLHS both on and off campus. I understand that being in leadership class is an honor and a privilege, not a right.

Breaking school rules whether great or small is a poor reflection on DLHS as a whole. Being placed on probation means that I will be one of the hardest working students in class. I will need to earn trust back. Being terminated is at the discretion of the advisor and administration and the severity of the offense.

I am expected to maintain an un-weighted 2.0 grade point average to maintain eligibility to hold office. I understand that an ASB card is needed to enter and participate at football games, basketball games, trips that entail bus transportation and other events as they come up. I understand that if I fail to fulfill the duties of my appointed or elected office I will be subject to removal from that office.
